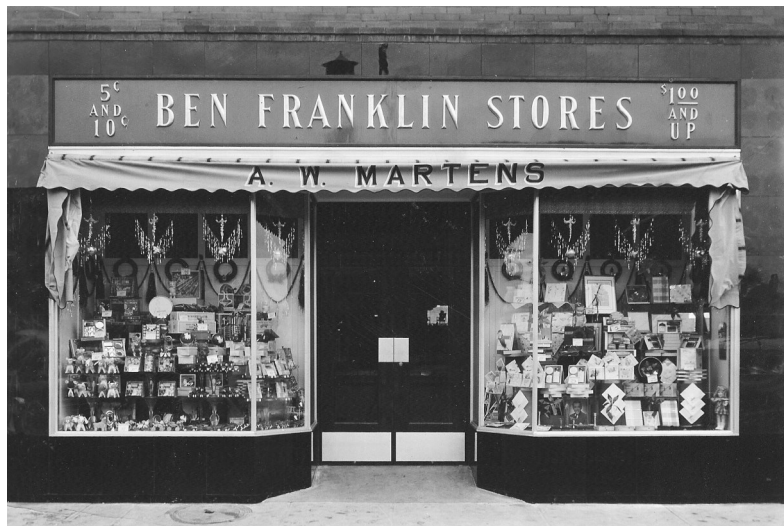
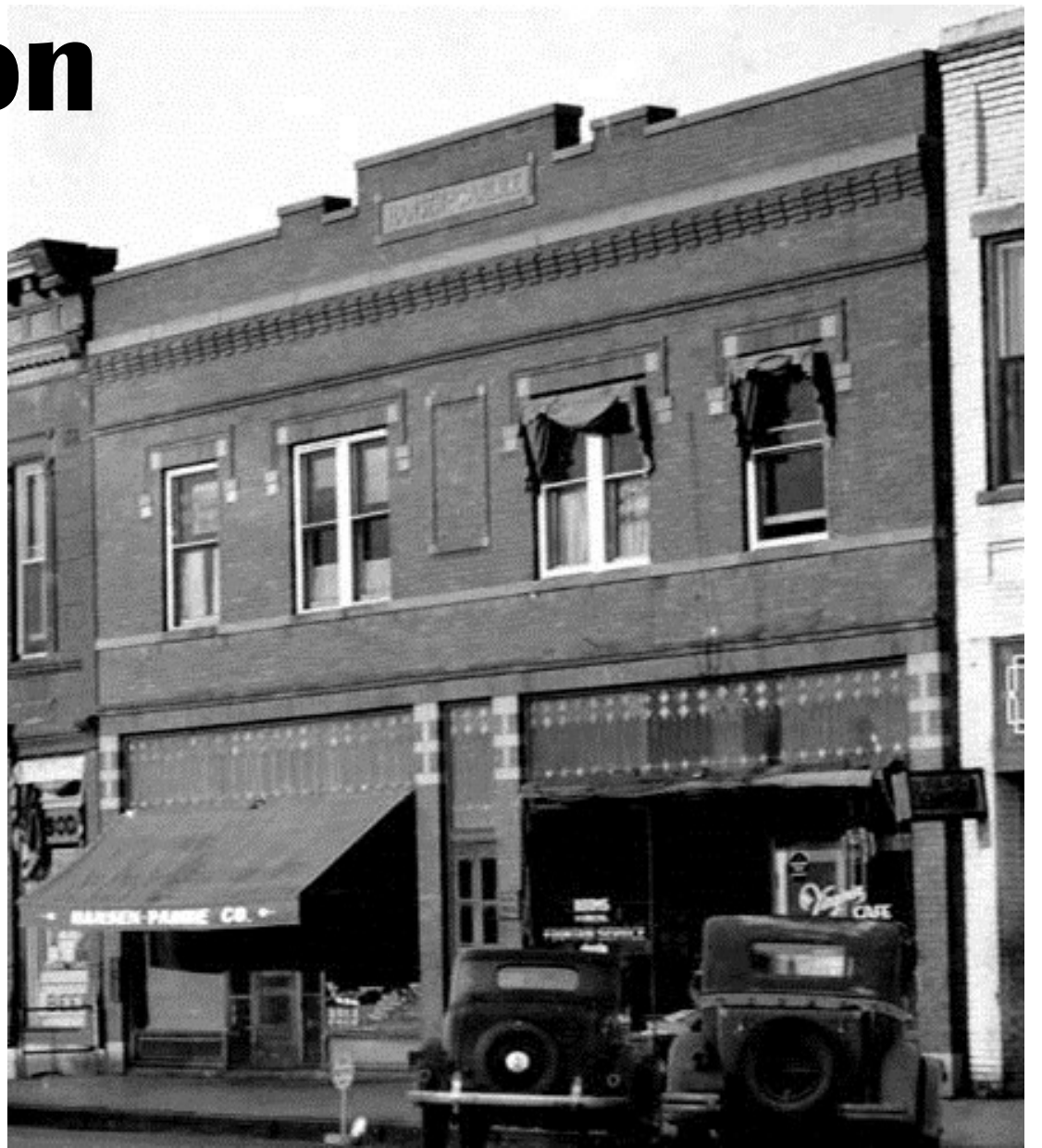

303 Storefront (right side of the building) - The Virginia Café and Hotel occupied the storefront of this building until 1935 when a variety store, operated by A.W. Martens, took the Ben Franklin franchise. The franchise was dropped in 1960 and became known as Martens Variety. The Martens family operated the store until 1978 when it was purchased by Marsha Clausen and Joyce Zubrod who renamed the business "The Dime Store." In 2003 the building housed Home Health Services. The upper level of the building housed offices of Dentist J.J. Miller until 1919, when Dr. R.A. McFate purchased the dental business. Purchased by Horizon Equipment, the building now houses the company's corporate offices.

305 Storefront –The Hansen family once had a grocery store at this location in the older one-story building. The Hansen & Pahde partnership formed in 1925. Pete Hansen ran the north half of the store as a grocery store, and Herman Pahde ran the south half as a clothing, millinery, and piece goods store. In 1956, Amos Rutz purchased Hansen's half and operated it as the A. and G. grocery store. This store closed in 1965 and marked the end of a continuous grocery store at this location for over 83 years. Pahde operated under the firm name of Pahde's Ready-to-Wear and Millinery from 1956 until 1964 when the Pahdes retired. Subsequent tenants of the building have included: Manning Auto Supply (1978), Manning Gas Company, and a law firm. On the upper level Dr. Virgil R. Anderson had a dentist office from 1921 until 1961. The building currently houses Heithoff, Hansen & Muhlbauer, CPAs.
